

Petra Vrtbovská, PhD

Dr. Vrtbovská lives in Prague (Czech Republic). Petra originally studied pedagogy, literature, and visual art, and had extensive experience as a teacher at secondary schools. Later she continued her studies in applied psychology and comparative science (PhD).

Since 2000 she has focused on counseling and psychotherapy. She specialized in developmental psychology and early trauma. She is also certified in Motivational Interviewing (2002), and in Pesso Boyden System Psychomotor Psychotherapy (2010).

In 2003 Dr. Vrtbovská established an Institute for Family Care Development called Natama. Natama focuses on therapeutic parenting, especially in foster care and adoptive families. Petra has got practice with therapeutic work with children, families, and parents as individuals.

DDP is one of the most important therapeutic tools she uses in her practice. Petra develops special approaches for work with institutionalized children. She also applies DDP principles in her work with adults.
